The Event: Dandiya Dazzle featured:


1. Dandiya Dance Extravaganza: Attendees danced in colorful ethnic attire, embracing the spirit of Navratri.




IIC-Institutions's Innovation Council




OPEN HOUSE DISCUSSION ON "LEGALIZATION OF MARIJUANA IN INDIA"

The Open House Discussion on the legalization of marijuana in India was organized by the Academic Club on 29th April 2024. The event consisted of two rounds, with a group discussion on the topic and individual opinions. The first round involved eight students discussing the NDPS Act, which prohibits the cultivation, possession, sale, purchase, transport, warehousing, use, consumption, inter-state, import, export, and import of cannabis in any form. The students had mixed opinions on the legalization of marijuana. Some supported the idea of creating a new industry, generating tax revenue, and creating jobs, while others opposed it. Some argued that legalization could create a new industry, reduce crime, and make medical treatments more accessible. Critics also feared increased drug experimentation and addiction, as well as potential impacts on adolescent brain development and academic performance. The judges evaluated leadership qualities, logical reasoning, communication skills, latest knowledge, and decision-making skills. The event concluded with winners and participants, and a vote of thanks to the faculty and team for their efforts.



ICICCT-2024

The ICICCT 2024 conference aimed to provide a platform for researchers, practitioners, and industry professionals to exchange ideas and explore the latest developments in Pattern Recognition & Intelligent Systems. The conference received 175 submissions, with 13 papers recommended for publication in Springer CCIS.
