

And moments as sweet as modak.



### INTERNATIONAL LITERACY DAY



International Literacy Day 2021 is observed universally on 8 September, which had been declared by UNESCO. As per UNESCO, globally around 773 million adults and young are still lacking basic literacy skills. ### RBI IMPOSES MONETARY PENALTY ON 14 BANKS FOR FLOUTING PROVISIONS





The Reserve Bank of India has imposed monetary penalty on 14 banks for flouting provisions of directions issued by the RBI. A scrutiny of the accounts of the companies of a group was carried out by the RBI. It was observed that the banks had failed to comply with provisions of one or more directions issued by RBI and/or contravened provisions of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949.

Notices were issued to the banks advising them to show cause as to why a penalty should not be imposed for non-compliance with the directions/contraventions of provisions of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949. Replies were considered, and the RBI concluded that it warranted imposition of penalties on the aforementioned fourteen banks.

# INNOVATION CORNER





## **BRICS AT 15**





The leaders of BRIC (Brazil, Russia, India, and China) countries **met for the first time in St. Petersburg, Russia, on the margins of G8 Outreach Summit in July 2006**. Shortly afterwards, in September 2006, the group was formalized as BRIC during the 1st BRIC Foreign Ministers' Meeting, which met on the sidelines of the General Debate of the UN Assembly in New York City. After a series of high-level meetings, the 1st BRIC summit was held in Yekaterinburg, Russia on 16 June 2009. BRIC group was renamed as BRICS (Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa) after South Africa was accepted as a full member at the BRIC Foreign Ministers' meeting in New York in September 2010. Accordingly, South Africa attended the 3rd BRICS Summit in Sanya, China on 14 April 2011.

BRICS is an important grouping bringing together the major emerging economies from the world, comprising 41% of the world population\*, having 24% of the world GDP\* and over 16% share in the world trade\*. BRICS countries have been the main engines of global economic growth over the years. Over a period of time, BRICS countries have come together to deliberate on important issues under the three pillars of political and security, economic and financial and cultural and people to people exchanges.

This year, the BRICS summit was hosted by India virtually on September 9. As it was the 15<sup>th</sup> summit overall, the theme was: **Intra Brics cooperation for continuity, consolidation and consensus. Delhi Declrataion was** released after the summit and it looks like China has emerged as the clear vision after the summit. The declaration expresses support to China to host Beijing 2022 Winter Olympics and Parlypics which were otherwise being called "Genocide Games" by several human rights groups and countries like U.S and Europe because of China's treatment of Uighur muslims. There were viewpoints that the winter olympics will be boycotted by several countries and that boycott will be lead by the QUAD countries (India, Australia, Japan and United States) but after this declration, it has become clear that India won't participate in any such boycott.





A lot of other points have also come up in the Delhi Declaration but as believed, they will have little or no impact on the ground like reform of UN system and its associated architecture and the document calls for increased participation by nations but how it will be done or if the new countries will get veto power or not it is not clear. Moreover, the document also calls for refraining violence in Afghanistan and condemns the terrorist attack on the Hamid Karzai Kabul International Airport. Russian President Vladimir Putin has issued a separate statement saying withdrawal of US forces led to the new crisis in **Afghanistan.** Which was expected as both Russia and China really happy about the US withdrawal from Afghanistan as it was not only humiliating but has also opened up new possibilities for further cooperation between them. In addition to it, this withdrawal further the deteriorates the concept of "U.S led world order". The BRICS countries have also adopted the counter - terrorism action plan under PM Modi's **chairship.** Workshops will be conducted under this and the countries will cooperate amongst themselves to counter terrorism and intelligence sharing will be done. BRICS Agricultural Research Platform has also come up in India which can also be viewed as the agricultural research platform of the BRICS countries. Both India and China avoided open clash over views on the origin of Covid 19 as Prime Minister Narendra Modi called for a 'transparent investigation' into the origins of the pandemic, a subject China is really sensitive about. He further added that 'if this is done, it will reduce the questions over WHO's credibility and we would be able to prepare for future pandemics as well'. President of the Chinese Communist Party said he opposed 'politicization' of the issue. Both the statements were included in the final document as the none of the counties wanted U.S – China tensions to have a spillover effect on the BRICS summit. How things change after this summit in the backdrop of an unresolved border standoff between India and China and latter trying to make sure that the winter Olympics are not boycotted because of Uyghur human rights violation remains to be seen.
