



The Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. Of India had invited detailed information from all universities and institutions to rank these under its newly launched scheme called **National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF).** These rankings were released today (dt. 4.4.16) by Smt. Smriti Irani Minister of HRD in Vigyan Bhawan. The ceremony was attended by a large number of Vice Chancellors, Directors and other academicians from all over India. The rankings in four categories namely Management, Engineering, Universities and Pharmacy were announced today. More than 3800 institutions and universities participated in this exercise.

It is heartening to note that JIMS Rohini attained 43<sup>rd</sup> spot in the management category in a list of top 50 institutions on an all India basis. It is further creditable that JIMS Rohini had applied in Category A which refered to 'Research and Teaching' rather than category B which is purely that of educational institutions. JIMS Rohini attains 22<sup>nd</sup> spot among the private unaided institutions. Another bright feature of JIMS Rohini has been that it has scored very high in Public and Academic Perception wherein more than 60,000 responses were received from public in general and 450 responses are received from experts and senior academicians.

Dr. J K Goyal Director JIMS expressed satisfaction at this achievement and said that it has been due to the ceaseless efforts of the management, the Governing Board and the Academic Advisory Council; the commitment and dedication of the faculty members and to the confidence reposed by the students and their parents in JIMS. Dr. Goyal complimented the efforts of Dr. Nassa, Member Secretary, NBA in bringing out these rankings in accordance with the declared time schedule and in the most transparent manner.
