Agenda 1: Review of Teaching Pedagogy and Innovative Learning Practices

- Members discussed the adoption of innovative pedagogical approaches such as Flipped Classroom, Gamification, AI-Assisted Learning, Slip Extempore, Quizzes, Assignments, Case Studies, and Research-Oriented Learning to enhance student engagement and learning outcomes.
- Faculty members were encouraged to incorporate interactive and experiential teaching methods that promote critical thinking, problem-solving, and active participation.
- The importance of integrating AI tools and technology-enabled learning resources into classroom teaching while ensuring ethical usage was emphasized.

- Faculty members were encouraged to show short videos during lectures followed by questioning, discussions, and quick assessments to improve conceptual understanding and retention.

- Members were informed about the 11th Annual Management Seminar – Surge 2K26 for BBA and B.A. (H) Economics students, scheduled on 18 April 2026 at JIMS Rohini.
- The seminar theme, “Next-Gen Skills: Leading in a Changing Business World,” aims to equip students with future-ready skills and insights into emerging industry trends.
- Members appreciated the initiative and emphasized ensuring maximum student participation and industry interaction.

Agenda 4: Review of Student Development, Industry Interaction and Institutional Enrichment Activities

- Workshops on Design Thinking, Critical Thinking, Innovation, Communication Skills, Personality Development, Digital Marketing, Financial Literacy, Cyber Security, Career Readiness, and Stress Management were successfully conducted.
